GENERAL ROUTE DESCRIPTION

The car park at Southrey is made up of compacted stone which is very uneven. The route from Southrey to Stixwould is tarmac with a 3 metre length section made of concrete.

The length of the route is approximately 2.7 km (approximately 1.7 miles). This makes the round trip approximately 5.4 km (approximately 3.4 miles).

Access to the route is free and there are no car parking charges.

Water Rail Way, Southrey - Stixwould Countryside for all In Lincolnshire







The Water Rail Way follows the bank of the River Witham and is on the track bed of the railway line which travelled from Lincoln to Boston.

This leaflet covers the stretch from Southrey to Stixwould. The tarmac route travels for a number of miles from both the start and finish of this route. There is a width restriction to access the site of 1.6 metres. The minimum width of the route is 2.6 metres.

The route along the river is home to a wide variety of bird life and there are also sculptures along the route.
