Arnhem Commemoration

In September 1944 men of the 1st Battalion Border Regiment, 2nd Battalion South Staffordshire Regiment and 7th (Galloway) Battalion King's Own Scottish Borderers, left their billets in and around Woodhall Spa to join the thousands who were flown in gliders to Arnhem, for their part in "Operation Market Garden". Often called "a bridge too far" the operation was a disaster and of the 2320 men who left Woodhall Spa, only 471 returned, after 9 days of fierce fighting: the rest having been killed, missing or captured.

About 180 people gathered for the Service

In 2010 a Memorial was dedicated in the grounds of the Cottage Museum in Woodhall Spa and every year since then Veterans have visited for a Service of Remembrance. This year marked the 71st anniversary and on Saturday September 12th they gathered in St. Peter's Church for the short Service, led by Priest in Charge, Revd. Richard Major. Afterwards they processed to the Museum grounds, where following the laying of wreaths, Bugler Roy Painter sounded The Last Post and the Standards were lowered for a two minutes silence. David Mullinger then spoke the final words of the Kohima Epitaph, "When you go home tell them of us and say, for your tomorrow we gave our today".

John Barker Trophy Awarded to Rodger Pickavance

An award ceremony was held at Washingborough Community Hall on 23rd. September to present Rodger Pickavance with The John Barker Trophy.

The John Barker Trophy, Community Building Volunteer Award is presented by Community Lincs annually. The award recognizes the work of those volunteers who, willingly and freely, give their time and effort to manage and maintain Lincolnshire community buildings.

Rodger Pickavance was nominated by the Executive Committee of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum's Board of Directors because he was the development project leader for the work. This was mainly funded by a Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) grant to the Woodhall Spa's award winning, volunteer run, Cottage Museum. His input was especially important during the second stage when the outbuildings suffered an arson attack. He was instrumental in securing the additionall funding necessary and liaised with architects, surveyors, conservation and planning officers. the builders and their subcontractors, storage firms, councillors and HLF personnel.

Thanks to National Lottery funding, the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum preserved and refurbished the main museum building, The Bungalow. The project also refurbished the museum's outbuildings – one of which is now partly utilised as a Community Room for local use. This achievement is the result of countless hours of teamwork by Cottage Museum volunteers and in particular the Development Committee chaired by Rodger.

Many unforeseen and challenging problems arose during the careful dismantling and reconstruction. Rodger dealt with these in a steady and meticulous fashion with excellent records being kept throughout the re-building programme. He has been a rock in dealing with all the issues and the result is a credit to the museum.

The 1940's Festival Weekend

It is not every day that the museum can claim to have welcomed "Sir Winston and Lady Churchill" into the garden, but this happened not once but twice during the weekend of the 1940's Festival. They arrived, accompanied by outriders, in a chauffeur driven limousine. Sir Winston delivered one of his famous speeches in deep sonorous tones to an enthusiastic crowd.





There were tables laid for a V.E.Day street party including fish paste sandwiches, tinned peaches, evaporated milk and jelly. Kitchenalia from the 1940's and authentic cookery books were displayed to the delight of many visitors.



We hosted entertainers on both days, Heather Marie and "Lancashire Jane" filled the air with renditions of wartime songs. А very appreciative audience sat in the sunshine. often joining in the choruses! St. Andrew's C. of E. School Choir was also verv well received.

Refreshments were served in the courtyard and proved to be so

popular that the cakes sold out on Saturday afternoon! Fresh supplies were hurriedly sought for Sunday's onslaught.

Museum merchandise was sold in the garden together with a tombola.

Three hundred and fifty people toured the museum and nearly three and a half thousand visited the garden.

Museum Guidebook

An attractive and abundantly illustrated new guide exploring the story of the Cottage Museum in Woodhall Spa as a family home is now on sale.

The building in which the Museum is housed is a rare example of a prefabricated corrugated iron bungalow from the late nineteenth century which was home to the Wield family for many years.

The story of the Cottage Museum is written through the eyes of John Wield who guides the visitor around the bungalow telling the story of the family and exploring the rooms. He sets the bungalow in context within the setting of Woodhall Spa at the time when he and his family lived in the village, including references to the activities and buildings of the time. He is somewhat intrigued by some of the more modern changes within the bungalow itself!

The Story of the Cottage Museum is on sale in the Museum Shop at the introductory price of only £2.50.

The Heart of the Spa...

During a recent sort out of some of my material, a seemingly on-going aspect of my life, I chanced upon a printout of a report dated 15 Sept 2014. The headline ran, "Victorian Woodhall Spa Baths to reopen after 30 years."

You can well imagine the emotions that I and countless other members of our community experienced on reading those words! I note that this does not come without cost, some £5 million at least, is the suggested figure. It will, of course, take time for the various permissions to be granted too but I trust they will be sympathetic to the area and the special atmosphere of Woodhall Spa, which helps to make it so appreciated in East Lindsey.

Of course, the Spa baths looked very different from today's poor shell of a building when I chanced upon it in 1969 for the first time. That exploration through the tall pine woods, past the old style corrugated iron Tea House in the Woods to the gentle mauve-coloured wisteriadecorated façade of the Spa building, will always stay in my memory.

There is another source of the water with its curative qualities being used to advantage and that is the Aqua Sante Spa at the Golf Hotel in Woodhall Spa.

This Spa is currently undergoing refurbishment and should be ready some time in 2016 and is all part and parcel of the magic, which is thankfully this lovely village we call home.

On a more personal note, both my wife and my elder daughter have received treatment at the old Spa under the aegis of the National Health Service. My daughter's appointment being one of the last on the day before the well collapsed in 1983!

So thirty years on, the old Spa is stirring into life!! Long may it last!
