

Displays for the New Season

The large display cabinet in the middle room will house the collection museum's cameras, projectors and related photographic memorabilia.





There was plenty for the children to do





From the Collection

This year Easter Day falls on the first Sunday in April, actually April 1st. In 1920 Easter Day also fell on the first Sunday in April, that happened to be the 4th. Woodhall Spa, however, remembers Easter Sunday 1920 for an altogether different reason.



That is the day that one of the iconic buildings of the village, and one that played a dominant part in its fame as a fashionable Spa, suffered a disastrous fire which eventually led to its demolition. That building was the Victoria Hotel. PH00891 shows a John Wield view which he has colour tinted to give an impression of the inferno. The Cottage Museum is fortunate to have some artifacts in its Collection, apart from photographs, which reflect the intensity of the heat generated. 1993.50 is the door number for room

70. 1993.52 is the reception desk bell and 1993.43 is a charred milk jug showing the hotel crest.





With the fire causing irreparable damage, the decision was taken to demolish the building. PC02070 shows demolition team pulling down the west elevation of the original hotel. The centre of the card shows the remains of the 1888 extension. Note no hi-vis iackets, hard hats or industrial mechanization. Amazingly, the man at the far left is in a suit!



Meet the Directors - Tracey Jones BA (hons), MA

I was born in New Zealand and spent my childhood growing up in Cockle Bay, Auckland with the beach just a ten minute walk from my house; it sounds idvllic - it was! We emigrated from New Zealand in the late 80s, to Syston in Leicestershire - where my parents still live. I then moved to Lincolnshire where I met my husband and have lived for over 25 years. My husband and I have five wonderful children who make us very proud. They have all done amazing things with their lives and achieved so much with their academic and professional careers. Each of them is so very different which has made for a very interesting and colourful life.

Throughout my adult life I have worked in accounting and administration predominantly focusing on revenue control and auditing. In 2006 I started my own online retail business as working from home offered me more flexibility with my young family. It was a steep learning curve and I learned many essential skills such as marketing strategies, budgeting, stock taking, and

customer service. However, as my children grew up I decided to go back to university to retrain.

My academic journey has exceeded my expectations. I graduated with a First in English and History from Bishop Grosseteste University, the Chancellor's Prize for Academic Achievement and the Dulcie Duke Local History Prize. I was awarded a funded scholarship to read for a Masters at the Centre for English Local History at the University of Leicester under Professor Keith Snell, where I graduated with a Distinction and the Harold Fox Prize. I was then awarded an Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) funded scholarship with the Heritage Consortium to research my PhD at Teesside University and a Post Graduate Certificate (PgCert) in Heritage at the University of Hull. I am now into the second year of my PhD researching representations of female identity in Victorian mining women in England and Wales.

As part of my Heritage degree I had to complete a work placement in the heritage industry. I chose to work at the Cottage Museum in Woodhall Spa; the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Springfield, USA; and the University of Illinois, Springfield. I have loved my time at the Cottage Museum – so much so that I have continued to volunteer, helping in all departments as and when needed. The friendliness and encouragement I have received from the volunteers and Directors has been inspiring and I consider myself very lucky to be part of the team! I would definitely encourage anyone interested to consider volunteering for this wonderful museum - it is so rewarding.

Woodhall Spa in March 1918

Dear Readers,

When will this war end? "Khaki Items" in the newspaper tells us about our lads at the front; it is awful, four have been killed already this year. There was Stanley Brigham whose mother keeps a guest house -"Glenesk" on the Broadway. He worked for Mr. Lee, the plumber. George Holmes also died in February; his poor wife and two children live in Mill Lane. Both men had full military funerals and twice we stood, cold and sad in the St. Andrew's

graveyard while four volleys were fired over the graves and all the jackdaws flew out of the trees in alarm. This month there has been Hugh Croft, the only son of the Crofts on Green Lane who was in the Machine Gun Corps. and Frank Sharp of King Edward Road was killed at the Somme.

It was good to see Private Wilson and Captain Hewson Street home on leave. Meanwhile, we continue to give to the Red Cross Hospital but it is getting hard to find anything to give.

The food situation is serious; the Food Ministry says tame rabbits should be bred for a future food supply. Lt. Col. Weigall has been made Chairman of the Food Survey Board. He had representatives of large catering stores at Petwood and said potato recipes, like potato toast and scones, would replace flour. My husband, Perce, likes potatoes but says he is beginning to look like one!

There are cheerful things too, like a very sporting hockey match which we won 5-3 against Horncastle. Of course, several of the players were women.

They say the pruning of trees along Witham Road improves visibility. That is good but they look awfully small – it is as if they did not want to repeat the exercise for 100 years.



Museum Grants and Activities

The Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum has been fortunate to receive a couple of grants to help towards maintaining the collections and attracting in new visitors.

The Lincolnshire Co-op Community Champion scheme selected three organisations looking for grants towards environmental concerns last year. The Museum was one of the three and has received £539.44 which will go towards equipment for environmental monitoring and protective film required on the windows that needs renewing. The cheque was presented by Tracy Butcher in the Woodhall Spa store, to the chairman, Mrs Patricia Duke-Cox.

The second grant has been awarded by the Museums Development East Midlands (MDEM) which has funded a heritage consultant to guide directors on how to increase the footfall at the museum and building a relationship with visitors. The grant of £1064 will allow new digital improvements and support the marketing leaflets of calendar of events in 2018.

The Museum opens its doors to the public on Good Friday, 30 March, and welcomes visitors from far and wide. Some groups will be able to take advantage of BOGOF offers if they are members of the Forces, NHS or Lincolnshire Co-op!

The New Tricks Singing Group now re-named "Sing Loud Woodhall Spa" has moved from the museum to the Methodist Hall. However there are many events planned for the new season starting on March 3rd at The Abbey Lodge where there is a Countdown Quiz. 
