
A Note from the Editor

Descendants of John Wield at the Museum


On Tuesday afternoon, 24th April, we were visited by John Wield Teanby and his lovely wife Maria for a look around our little museum, which was the family home of one of John's family at the turn of the last century. It turns out that John is the great nephew of John Wield who lived with his family in the prefabricated bungalow that has become the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum.

Maria has done quite a bit of family history research which traces the family tree back to the 1600s and they are happy to share the details with our collection team in order to provide a bigger picture for our archives.

In addition to signing our guest book they said that they would tell all their family about our unique museum, so we can expect to see a few more Wield descendants visiting us soon. John is

pictured in the Wield Room by a photo on the wall taken by John Wield of his family when they lived in the property; very appropriate!

We were also visited by another 7 descendants of the Wield family. This time it was Angela Hudson-Peacock plus 2 generations. Angela's grandson Monty is doing photography at school and is using the Wield family, particularly John Wield, as the subject for his project. Receptionist Rosemary Brown commented: "It was lovely to meet such a charming family".


Pre-Opening Event



From the Collection

Beside the Seaside

At this time of year thoughts turn to the summer holidays and for children, like Christmas, it is a magical time of the year. Here are three interesting images probably all taken by John Wield in the first decade of the 20th century.



PH04852 was taken at the North Landing near Bridlington on the North Yorkshire coast. Noticeable is the steep incline of the landing stage and many people are clambering over the rocks. In the foreground is a young woman who looks to be buying from the lad. Maybe shrimps, prawns or crabs.

PC02503 Again probably taken on the Yorkshire coast, four adults are sitting in the calm sea. Who they are is unknown. In the background a rowing boat is discharging its passengers into a horse drawn cart. The boat, with such a shallow beach can probably not get any closer.





PH04885 A delightful composition I am absolutely convinced from the camera of John Wield. It was taken at Skegness on a chilly day and shows a splendid view of the pier before it became a ruin. In the foreground is a 'graduated' row of children which may include John's children, Effie and Cedric.





Woodhall Spa in July 1918

Dear Readers,

This village is no longer the merry and optimistic spa it was. Another 5 of our young men have been killed fighting the Hun.

Last time I wrote to you, Capt. Hewson Street of Witham Road had been home on leave. He was a very brave man, mentioned in dispatches and awarded the Military Cross. But, oh dear, in May we heard that he had died during the attack on the Marne. Before him there was Henry Maynard who ran the pharmacy, Frank Sharp of King Edward Road, Maurice Leach of Stixwould Road and Edward Eyre - everybody knew him because he was chauffeur for the charabanc of Mr. Dickinson. So many dear young men, the village is saddened.

The village Squire, Capt. S.V. Hotchkin has been awarded the Military Cross for gallantry. He is well respected here, serving on the U.D.C and quietly helping many villagers, as well as tending his golf course. There have been complaints about the condition of that and I said to Perce that some of the toffs who play could pay to have it looked after but he said it was not lack of money but men that was the problem.

We have been given new ration books. They last 16 weeks and there are different coloured pages for various comestibles like dairy goods, meat, sugar. It is very difficult because when we have visitors we have to take their books and work out how to use the coupons while they are staying.

Lt. Col. and Mrs. Weigall have instigated a War Distress Fund. Recently, they took a box at the Theatre Royal in Lincoln. After the performance, the Lt. Col. acted as auctioneer for several items, then his wife swept off her grey fox fur stole, for auction. It sold for 11 guineas after which she bought it back for the same amount, thus benefitting the fund by 22 guineas!







"Create and Paint" 10.00 am – 3.30 pm The theme for this activity day is "Alice in Wonderland"


10.00 am -12.00 pm Have fun making a variety of crafts including crowns, masks, hats and clocks.
