
A Note from the Editor

The Bell Award 2022

This year the Directors have given the prestigious Bell Award to Chloe Taylor, a young volunteer.

The Bell Award is given from time to time to a young person who has done something of merit for the Museum. The award came about as a result of a burglary at the Museum when the Bell Cup, which belonged to the Woodhall Spa Agricultural Show Society, was stolen. The Bell family, who had donated the cup, had retained the rights to it and donated the insurance payment to the Museum, but asked that the memory of Joseph Bell maintained. The Museum Trustees at the time agreed to do this through the Bell Award.

"Axle Cooling" - London to Woodhall Spa

Our "Mellow Observer," author of "Axle Cooling" in 1890, tells us he travelled from London to Woodhall Spa by train.

The railway timetable of that year may make us envious. While the length of the journey varied, the popular 12.50 train from King's Cross arrived in Woodhall Spa in only 3 hours 30

minutes. The station, behind the shops on the Broadway, was central in the village.

What did Mellow Observer make of his journey? "The comfort of the conveyance and the speed attained forced a lively interest in my surroundings, at first many chimney pots, then, embankments, meadows and a whirring roar, as we flew along the veins of the railway in wild fury. When the engine gave its last belch of white vapour we slid gracefully to the platform at Woodhall Spa. I confess, at a hasty glance I was not vitally shaken by sudden wonder but then I found myself felicitated by helpful hands and enveloped by delicious air under a clear sky. I had been conveyed with ease to this Bethesda among the pine trees."

Isn't that splendid? Perhaps, next time someone asks me where I come from, I might cause a little confusion by replying, "Oh, Bethesda, you know."

From the Collection

A number of notable events have occurred in Woodhall Spa over the years and in June of this year occurred the centenary of one such event. Namely the return of the Weigall family to England, Woodhall Spa and their country home, Petwood, journeying from across the world in Australia.

In 1919, Archibald Weigall accepted the appointment of Governor of South Australia. He was made a KCMG (Knight of the Order of St Michael and St George) becoming Sir Archibald. He and his wife Lady Grace Weigall and their six-year-old daughter, Priscilla, left in May 1920 arriving in Australia in June of that year.

He became disenchanted with the financial machinations of the State Parliament and this resulted in him paying out of his own pocket for staff and the public duties he performed, leaving him with only £300 per annum as salary. He resigned in December 1921 after only 19 months in post. His departure prompted the premier to raise the Governors salary to cover costs.

May 1922 the Weigalls commenced their journey to England and on the evening of Friday June 9th arrived in Woodhall to much delight and ceremony. They were driven in an open-top car from Kirkstead (Woodhall Junction) station so that the residents could see them en route to Petwood. At Chapman's corner the people of Woodhall presented Lady Weigall with a bouquet of flowers and the couple with an illuminated address welcoming their return and thanking them for the using of Petwood as a temporary hotel. At Petwood they were greeted by their head gardener, Thomas Williams, who gave Priscilla a riding crop, (illustrated left). The house itself, was decked with flags and bunting.

Music in the Garden

650-700 people.



The Annual Memorial Lecture

This year the museum is presenting a very special lecture entitled "Re-presenting the Holocaust".

It will be delivered by James Bulgin, who is Head of Content for the New Holocaust Galleries at the Imperial War Museum. Before joining IWM, James worked as a commercial theatre producer and director, with work at the West End and on national tour, and co-wrote the play When Darkness Falls. He is currently completing a PHD under the Crosslands Scholarship at Royal Holloway College, University of London, on ideas of apocalypse in Holocaust and Cold War history. His academic research focuses on issues of representation in Holocaust literature and film.


In October 2021 the new Holocaust Galleries were opened at the Imperial War Museum. In this talk their curator, James Bulgin, will take us through the development of the new galleries from their inception, all the way through the design process and up to their opening.

James will discuss the central ideas behind the galleries and how the team sought to achieve them, sharing some of the challenges faced and how his team navigated the final phases of the project through the international pandemic. The Galleries use over two thousand new objects, together with stories of their owners that help to shed a new light on the Holocaust and the course of WW2 by those who witnessed or were affected by Many of the stories are deeply personal and have never been published before.



Woodhall Spa - November 1922

Dear Readers

Our summer Season has ended. Perce and I had our usual visitors but our village is still not thriving as it did before the Great Hostilities.

At both Woodhall and Kirkstead Sports there were less competitors and less spectators. It was a dismal, rainy day at Kirkstead and a balance of only £3-18-1d was raised.

There was sadness in June at the death of Dr. Gwyn. He treated just about the whole village and was always on call when there was an accident. They buried him in St. Andrew's cemetery.

But why am I telling you about miserable matters? The most astonishing thing has happened! You remember me telling you about Lord and Lady Weigall returning from Australia? Well, when they got back they saw how depressed we all were and Lady Weigall had the idea of providing a moving picture place to cheer us up! Imagine, in Woodhall Spa! A licence was granted for a year, including Sundays! Sundays! What would Grandmamma say?

In September, an advertisement in the newspaper stated, "Pavilion Picture House, Woodhall Spa. Opening night Monday 11th September 1922. Prices 2/4, 1/6, 8d, including tax. Show commences at 7.45." The Pavilion is in the woods, where concerts are performed.

Everyone was so excited! Then, at the opening night, "The Lion Eaters" did not come, so they had to show something by Charlie Chaplin instead. However, everybody was full of praise for the new venture and for Lady Weigall, of course. Some folk are saying they will go every time the picture changes!

Perce says he won't go until it is more reliable and he certainly won't be frittering money on it every week. However, I am sure his curiosity will win! I will tell you about our visit next time I write.
