
A Note from the Editor



The Donkey Story









The donkeys were kept at the bungalow in one of the outbuildings where the new general store room has been built. This was the location for the lovely photograph above of Effie, Thomas's Granddaughter and the donkey.

This year, that long association with the donkey has been celebrated by the commissioning of a near life size donkey made from steel plate. Mick Toyne Engineering, specialists in rustic ironwork, was commissioned to produce the donkey, which was delivered and installed on March 22nd by James Wilderspoon, who now runs the business. The project was generously funded by a grant from the People's Postcode Lottery Trust, for which the Directors are very grateful.








From the Collection

THE STEREOGRAPHS

Stereographs were a very popular form of photography in the 19th century. Using a special camera, photographers would take two nearly identical images which, when printed side by side, would appear as a three-dimensional image when viewed through a set of special lenses called a stereoscope. John Wield was a keen admirer of this technique and personally carried out experiments.






John Wield's stereoscope and his 3rd experiment

He built his own hand-held stereoscope. He also constructed a larger coin-operated version which was available for the public to view at the Bungalow's gate. In fact he made a stereograph of the stereoscope. The Museum has in its collection, 174 stereographs, of which 163 were taken by John, 11 are commercially produced.

The subject matter was, as usual with John, extremely wide as well as unusual from buildings, sea views, people, to the seed head of a dandelion. Here is an example, a dew-drop on a blade of grass.

Following an enquiry from overseas, Patricia was able to send the architect a copy of the Boulton and Paul catalogue, which he has since acknowledged was "actually very useful". GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION DONATION



Woodhall Spa in July1919

Dear Readers.

Woodhall Spa is not the flourishing village it was before the war. So far this season we have not had swarms of visitors. My daughter, Ellen, says they have had fewer patients at the Baths. She says people are saying that ladies and gentlemen no longer feel justified in indulging in frivolous Spa holidays after so much suffering and death. Perce says it is because they have got not the cash. Certainly, everyday commodities are all dearer than before hostilities began.

A beautiful marble and alabaster memorial to Captain Hewson Street, has been placed in St. Peter's Church. He died after being wounded in action on the Marne last year and was awarded an M.C with Bar for his bravery. His parents, Henry and Eliza live in "The Hawthorns," Witham Road. Mercifully, his brother, Sydney, survived the fighting.





"Chapman`s London Manchester Stores" still has long advertisements for its provisions, including Canadian Hams and Colonial Cheese. McKellar's on the Broadway still stock foreign wines, Mackeson's (anti-ageing stout and energising) ales and gins, Jansel's Rum, Raynal's Brandy and Old Scotch Whisky.

Our son, Alfred, says that he is kept busily employed at Dickinson's garage. During the war Mr. Dickinson took orders for motor cars for after it ended! He stocks several makes, such as

Daimler, Belsize, Ford and Sunbeam and he has clever advertisements, like "If you are a motorist and are not dealing with me, we are both losing money."

Perce has come back from the Mall (not before time) with the rumour that Lt. Col. Weigall is giving some land on Stixwould Road, opposite Petwood, to the village for "recreation." It is very generous of him; he also gave us the cricket ground before the war. I wonder what form of recreation this will be?


