A Note from the Editor

At last we can see a route to freedom and a future that even resembles normality. If the first three Steps along the "Roadmap" are achieved on time, we plan to re-open the museum on Thursday May 20th. The museum will be open Thursdays to Sundays from 10.30am to 4.00pm (last admissions at 3.30pm) plus Bank Holidays, until Sunday October 31st. In addition many of our usual events are planned to go ahead, subject to any restrictions at the time and up-to-date information will be available on our website www.cottagemuseum.co.uk and our Facebook, Twitter and Instagram pages. The plan is outlined on page 12.

When we open, the long awaited Railway display will be available in the Temporary Exhibition Room. This marks the 50th anniversary of the closing of the railway through Woodhall Spa and is a joint venture between ourselves, local railway enthusiasts Alan



and Sue Stennett and the Horncastle History and Heritage Society. It is also hoped that an accompanying lecture will be given. Details of when are still being worked on, due to the Covid uncertainty, but definitely an event worth attending.

Once again the Friends of the museum are being offered a chance to look around the museum on one of the days when it is closed to the public, probably a Wednesday. This concession is free of charge and is a great opportunity to browse the exhibits at length.

The museum's new publication "Taking the Waters" about the Spa Baths and surrounding area is now available and Patricia Duke-Cox gives us an update on page 3 opposite.

How this season pans out is very much in the lap of the gods, but given a following wind we should have a longer season than we had last year, so let's cross our fingers and hope we will all be able to meet each other in person at some of the events this year. I look forward to it.

Museum Collections and Displays for 2021

During 2020 some 89 new items were added to the museum's collection. Some of these are planned to go on permanent display including a number of photographic items donated by John Wilkinson.

Patricia Duke-Cox, Head of Collections, was able to attend some Zoom webinars during the lockdown period. These were related to Collection Care and also administration and documentation procedures. Annette Southcott also attended a meeting on manuals and documentation procedures.

All the photographic items were removed from the Darkroom at the close of last season and are being cleaned prior to being returned during March. There will also be some new items in the Darkroom display this season.

The Temporary Exhibition Room was also cleared in readiness for the brand new display on the railways and Woodhall Spa, covering the arrival of the railway and the closure 50 years ago. New display boards have been prepared courtesy of Alan and Sue Stennett, to illustrate this fascinating story. The last train ran on 5th April 1971, but sadly we will not be open, due to the restrictions, to celebrate that date as hoped.

Latest Publication

The latest addition to the Museum's range of books on the history of the area and dissemination of access to the visual assets is the book "Taking the waters at Woodhall Spa: from the archives of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum". It was decided to have a short print run of 150 cased books for this title as the "Gardens of the Petwood: from the archives of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum" sold out within a year of publication.

Pre-publication prices and local advertisements have enabled more than 50 copies to be claimed ahead of the book launch. This was intended to be a social event but Coronavirus restrictions have curtailed that idea and orders have been fulfilled by a staggered invitation to visit the Community Room behind the Museum in early March.

A book launch is being considered for Wednesday 19th May in the afternoon. Please check the website to see if that option is available.

Our Donkey at the Gate

Our beautiful steel donkey silhouette, which is located just inside the main gate as you enter the museum garden, continues to attract interest, with many people asking what is its significance.

For a long time the Directors had wanted something eye catching, particularly for children, to attract people to notice the museum and hopefully pay us a visit. A couple of years ago the idea of placing a donkey of some sort, to reflect the use of donkeys by the Wield family at the site was mooted. Finally the idea of a donkey silhouette made from steel plate, along the lines of the horses in Horncastle was suggested. Tom Johnson took charge of the project and after discussions with Mick Toyne Engineering in West Ashby, near Horncastle, the project got underway. The donkey was finally delivered and installed on March 22nd 2019 by James Wilderspin, who now runs the business. The project was generously funded by a grant from the People's Postcode Lottery Trust, for which the Directors are very grateful.

To allow people to understand the significance of the donkey and hopefully, to tempt them to visit, Lynnette Needham has had an interpretation board produced, which Ken Mair has framed and erected. The board outlines the story of Thomas and John Wield and their donkeys. Briefly the building which is now The Cottage Museum was the home of the Wield family from 1887 until the 1960s. Thomas Wield and his son John set up a business using donkey-drawn and hand-drawn chairs to transport patients from the Railway Station and the various hotels in Woodhall Spa to the popular Spa Baths.

John Wield himself was a keen photographer and it is his photographic collection that forms



the basis of the museum. The collection includes several pictures of the donkeys, together with his family.

Research and Use of the Collections

Approaches were made to, and welcomed by, the Museum during the recent lockdown periods in 2020 and 2021. Some relate to family history and others from researchers for books or university dissertations, whilst others might be just general curiosity. Our collections team and researchers use the Museum database along with open access websites such as Ancestry, British Newspaper Archive, Forces War Records for example. In some cases, the request is passed on to someone with greater knowledge of the area of interest.

Family history enquiries this year have included a request from a Polish descendant to identify if a camp site was at Roughton. Another was to find out more about a haberdashery shop in Woodhall Spa that a grandmother had run and similarly another was to find why the current Bookfayre building is also known at Matthew Temple House. It should be noted that it is not always possible to resolve an enquiry.

A lady from America wrote with grateful thanks to the Museum for the history she learned from the website. She is writing a book on the life of Elspeth Grahame, wife to Kenneth Grahame of "Wind in the Willows" fame. She was able to share letters written by Elspeth in 1904 that are in the collections of the Bodleian Library and we were able to decipher the writing and offer explanations of the medical conditions therein.

Academic research was also the reason for a local archivist for the U3A to contact the Museum about a survey of the High Street changes over the last 40 years and the guidebooks in the Museum's library were consulted to help establish what businesses were in existence over that period. More recently a university student of history is preparing her first dissertation with a focus on Royal Square where the Royal Hydropathic Hotel and the Mall were situated.

Lincolnshire County Council are undertaking a 3-year project focusing on 30 towns, of which Woodhall Spa is one. A meeting with three directors, past and present, enabled the sharing of information for the survey and it is hoped that later this year there will be a "pop-up" exhibition when the results can be shared with the general public.

In some cases, pictures are requested along with previous history of a place. Most recently there has been interest in a business on The Broadway where Fuller's Garage was sited and a petrol pump still remains.

Recently an insurance valuation was suggested for an autograph book that was on display in the Museum last year. It contains over 80 signatures from air force personnel from World War II with rank and honours included. Research is currently continuing to identify all those named within the pages and the majority have been found.

The Museum is proud of its collections. The opportunity to share some knowledge about them has been agreed with the support of a heritage grant from Museums Development East Midland and the Earth Museum website. It is intended that 50 items will be posted this year and similar for the subsequent two years. There will be more information on this project in future editions of this newsletter.




HARD WORK







Events Planned for 2021

As things stand at the moment the museum will open its doors to the public for the 2021 season on Thursday 20th May. The plan is to open on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from May 20th until the end of October from 10.30am. to 4.00pm. plus Bank Holidays. The government's Road Map for releasing lock down measures is to be back to near normality by

June 21st. It is therefore with this in mind that some of our usual events are now planning to go ahead.

Jane Hodgson has organised a Quiz trail in the museum for children, which will be up and running from day one. If the 40s Weekend goes ahead over the weekend of July 17th/18th, the garden with usual tents for the various displays etc. and the covered patio area will offer refreshments from the Café. It is very unlikely a music event will take place in the Methodist Hall on Friday evening July 16th given the small space and numbers of people involved.

We have a full programme of "Music in the Garden" events booked through the month of August. Over the last few years these Sunday afternoon musical events have become very popular and quite often there is barely a spare seat to be had, as can be seen from our picture taken at the CATS performance in 2019. The Patio Café is planned to be open for all these garden events.



Woodhall Spa - March 1921

Dear Readers,

Spring is here and fields and woodlands are sprinkled with the wild flowers which so delight our visitors from smoky towns.

There has been much anxious discussion about the sad ruin of our renowned Victoria Hotel. Sir Archibald and Lady Weigall have graciously offered Petwood as a prestigious hotel in its place. Of course, they are residing at Government House in Adelaide, in the far away continent of Australia but their kindness towards this village is boundless. Perce came back from the Mall with the information that the remains of the hotel are to be sold but from which of his dubious acquaintances in that hostelry he gleaned this, I know not.

What elderly residents call "horseless carriages" are still the cause of mishaps on our roads. Perce's pal, Albert Chapman, was proceeding to work on his bicycle when the mail van from Horncastle caught his back wheel, causing him to be tossed into the dyke. The driver had the good grace to fish him out and convey him to his home, where Dr. Gwyn was summoned. He

pronounced Albert to be shocked and swollen but as well as

could be expected.




Shopkeepers are engaged in declaring their wares. Sleight and Crookes, on Tattershall Road, solicit enquiries about paperhanging and distempering. Alfred, our son, said he would collect their book of patterns and tint cards as he is disenchanted with my frequently expressed displeasure at the condition of the parlour walls.

Forster's Supply Stores, adjacent to the Post Office (telephone number 2) specialise in fancy goods and drapery, as well as groceries. They hope for sales around Eastertide.

I use Hickson's Stores, the cheapest house for all sorts of provisions, such as margarine and sago and their lard compound is only one shilling and eight pence a pound.

Of course, the upper class ladies of the village patronise Chapman's London and Manchester Stores, at the crossroads. They have freshly ground coffee, fine teas sent all over England and cheeses and hams from the continent of Europe!
