#### From the Museum Collection

PH00763 This atmospheric picture is from a postcard, possibly taken by John Wield. It appears to be The Broadway. The building in the middle of the picture looks like St Peter's Church, which would mean that the water from the hose is squirting into the grounds of the Golf Hotel.

The problem is the sign on the left-hand side. The second word on the top line is probably Hotel, but the others cannot be read. If we have the location right, then it would be in the grounds of the Alexandra Hospital. Puzzling! We assess that, from the dress and lorry that it was probably taken around the time of the First World War. It is possibly a demonstration by Woodhall Spa Urban District Council Fire Brigade. Is the water coming from a fire hydrant; no one is manning the tender pump?



PH001170a This print is taken from a damaged John Wield glass plate negative. The first set of

questions are who are the people and where and when was it taken? The lady looks terrified and the gentleman bored. Then you look closer at the tricycle and more questions arise. Do the 2 levers just steer the tricycle or power it? If they power it, then I cannot figure out how the movement of the levers drives the wheels and how would it be steered? Does the box under the seat have a battery and motor in it, it looks rather small for that, especially if it is to pull the bath chair. Answers on a £20 note (The development fund needs it!).





#### Dedication of the Arnhem Memorial

On Saturday morning, 18th. September a large congregation assembled in the garden of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum to dedicate a memorial to the men who were billeted in Woodhall Spa and the surrounding areas in 1944, before being airlifted to fight at Arnhem as part of Operation Market Garden. Of the 2320 men who left Woodhall Spa only 471 returned after 9 days of fierce fighting. Veterans of the battle mingled with Civic Dignitaries, including The High Sheriff of Lincolnshire, John Godfrey, The Lord Lieutenant of Lincolnshire, Tony Worth, invited guests and members of the public, to pay tribute to fallen comrades.

The Service of Dedication was introduced by Revd. Andrew Smith Priest in Charge, St. Peter's Church, Woodhall Spa. The Revd. Colin Watkins, Minister, Woodhall Spa Methodist Church, conducted the dedication of the memorial. The hymn "Abide With Me" was then sung to the accompani-



ment of The Mareham-le-Fen Victory Silver Band. Last Post was sounded, followed by the "Ode To The Fallen" spoken by Father John O'Donnell, Parish Priest, Church of Our Lady and St Peter Roman Catholic Church, Woodhall Spa. After two minutes silence, Reveille was sounded and Revd. Andrew Smith read "The Airborne Prayer and Blessing".

Wreaths were then laid, led by The Lord Lieutenant of Lincolnshire, followed by representatives of the Veterans and Regimental Associations.

Lunch was provided at St. Peter's Church Hall for The Veterans and guests, followed by the showing of the vintage film "Theirs Is The Glory" at The Kinema in the Woods, together with community singing to the accompaniment of The Compton Kinestra Organ. An exhibition of work by local schools entitled "War and Peace" was staged in St. Peter's Hall during the afternoon.

The local Air Training Corps provided valuable assistance throughout the day, including looking after the Veterans and Arnhem Veteran Eric Booth donated £100 to the local ATC.

All who attended the dedication were touched by the occasion, which was very emotional at times, but also had moments of great humour and camaraderie.

#### A Fresh Pair of Eyes:

From a young person's perception, without being prompted, Arnhem means little or nothing. In very much the same way, I imagine that a young person, if asked, in 1944, about a battle that took place in the 1890s, would equally have little or no knowledge of the subject, who was involved, or what it was about.

However, once I had read-up on the story of Arnhem from information gleaned from the internet, I did find it a fascinating read. The first thing that became apparent from the story is how complicated it must have been to organize all those men and their equipment to be in the right place at the right time and to have to work with equipment that was not fit for purpose, such as inaccurate maps and walkie-talkies with low communication range. Also, intelligence information gathered was both misleading and inaccurate; the British troops were told the Germans were poorly equipped and that their moral was low, which proved to be completely wrong. Add to this poor weather conditions and it made for an incredible difficult and dangerous operation to perform, with the chances of success being very limited. Yet despite all the obstacles these people fought bravely, with little thought for their own safety, determined to do the job to the very best of their ability, with the information and tools they had been given.

From a young person's point of view, it is helpful to be reminded of the hardship that these people endured and overcame and to put into perspective some of the problems that beset us today, which are quite trivial by comparison. We must learn to use our initiative to sort out our day-to-day problems and be more accommodating in helping each other. Thanks to battles like Arnhem, despite its failings for the allied forces, the tyranny of Nazi Germany was defeated and Arnhem had played its part in enabling us to live in a free and open democracy, as opposed to communist countries such as China and totalitarian states like North Korea and we should remember and appreciate that.

## Our Woodhall Spa's Forefathers continued.....

Newsletter readers will remember the Right Honourable Henry Chaplin (1841-1923), the first Viscount Chaplin, member of the syndicate which planned the expansion of the then tiny Woodhall Spa, and who had his family seat at Blankney Hall, Lincolnshire. His social circle was of the highest in the land and included the future Edward VII amongst its august members! Thanks to the wonders of cyberspace, some emails from Ernie Sealey in Cheshire arrived in my inbox as I browsed its contents here in Lincolnshire a little while ago! Thank you, Ernie, for giving me permission to share elements of their interesting and informative contents with our readers. One of the stories of our sporting country squire told the graphic tale and its consequences of his victory in the 1867 Derby with Hermit. This exceptional chestnut stallion had won despite running in a snowstorm at 1000:15 odds in a race with 10 false starts!! We are now taken into the second of the hunting, shooting and fishing country gentleman's pursuits and I quote.....

"Just a little bit more info on Henry Chaplin for you. After his win at the 1867 Derby he went to the "toffs gun shop" Purdey and ordered four 12 bore shot guns. The only survivor of the four is still in use today though I do not use it as often as I once did."

Ernie went on to describe how he had come across a wreck of a gun in a dealer's car, managed to scrape the money together to buy it (he was only 20!) as it had the magical name 'Purdey' inscribed on it. "after nearly seven and a half years and the cost of what sometimes did feel like every penny I earned I shot the gun for the first time. But in the end it is a vintage Purdey gun and you can count the number of owners of such guns on one hand and to be in your twenties well no words can describe what you feel."

Ernie went on to give further details...

Maker: James Purdey 3141/2 Oxford Street London, Year of Manufacture: 1869, Construction: Side by Side Bar in Wood, Thumb Leaver Action, Hammer Gun, Gauge :12, Barrels: 30 inch Damascus steel, Nitro proof.

"It was not until 2007 that I contacted Purdey to see who they initially built the gun for. It did not seem to matter to me until I wrote a small article on the trials and tribulations of restoring the gun of that age and value in the 1970s. Two interesting facts came out of their letter other than Henry Chaplin Esq. One

my gun was number 1 of a set of 4 (very few people had the financial resources to order 4 guns from Purdey at one time) and the other was each gun cost £65 and in 1869 that really was nearly a king's ransom when viewed from a normal working man's position."

Thank you so much, Ernie, for your fascinating emails which took me once again into Henry Chaplin's world as I must confess to being very much a learner as regards the world of the Purdey and its delights! It was a real pleasure to know that the newsletter of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum is reaching so far afield! I wish you many more hours of enjoyment in reading future editions and with the No 1 gun especially!








