#### **Development Progress**

In the last two articles on the development I have been asking you to support our appeal for funds. This one will be no different, but, since the editorial team have kindly given me two pages, it will allow me to give you more information about how your money will be spent and the extra facilities that the development will allow us to provide in your Cottage Museum. I say this because this is a community museum run by volunteers from the community for the community.

The first obvious improvement will be to increase the life of The Bungalow, primarily by replacing the rotting sole plate that the walls are mounted on and also replacing any badly corroded sheets. However, we will also introduce insulation and an improved heating system to reduce running costs and make the internal environment more pleasant (At present, too hot in the summer and too cold in winter). The displays will also be greatly improved, but still be in keeping with the museum's present philosophy.


The museum's store room, work room and meeting room is currently the small back room in the bungalow and, as can be seen from the photograph, any more than 4 people in there and it becomes cosy! All these requirements, and more, will be transferred to the rebuilt outbuildings. I have included a schematic of the proposed layout to give you an idea of what the floor plan will be.

The Bungalow, Iddesleigh Road, LN10 6SH <u>General Store</u> The general store will be for those items that do not require the higher level of storage conditions; for example, admin filing cabinets, tables, chairs and garden tools etc. We shall have to store the photographic materials in cabinets with low humidity and these will probably be in this store.

<u>Community Archive</u> This will be an exciting new facility that the museum will be able to offer. In addition to the 6500 items of photographic material and artefact collection that the museum has, we also have the Urban District Council Records and the Spa Baths Trust Records, plus the museum's scrap-books. The aim is to digitise these records and make them available for researchers. There will be two dedicated work stations to allow input and output. Digitising the data will allow rapid access to the material. The room will also house the museum's library. Part of this room will be the museum's admin area which at present, is usually found in various directors' homes! Whilst not an exciting subject, professional administration is vital to the smooth running of all aspects of the Cottage Museum's operations.

<u>Bath Chair Store</u> Despite the significant damage suffered by the bath chair in the arson attack, it is still possible to see what it looked like and we propose to put it on display in its own area. In the fullness of time, it will either be rebuilt or, if a similar one can be found, possibly replaced.

We are still on track to having the Round 2 submission to HLF by the end of August. This means that we will be rebuilding the outbuildings during 2012 and refurbishing the bungalow over the winter of 2012/13. Now comes the begging bit; we still have a long way to go to meet the appeal target! 

Readers of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum's newsletter will have no difficulty, I hope, in recognising the name 'Stanhope'! Just think! There's Stanhope Avenue, just off the Broadway, which leads directly to attractive Victorian-canopied shopping at the heart of our community. Then six or so miles away lies the town of Horncastle with its elegant Stanhope Monument situated in the market place and, of course, the newly named Stanhope Hall, fought for and won in recent times by another community which also values its precious heritage. Again there's the Stanhope connection with Revesby too! What is more, the erstwhile family seat of the Stanhopes was at Chevening! Bequeathed to the nation by the seventh and last Earl Stanhope, it proved of sufficient stature to become the official residence of the Foreign Secretary after being initially considered as a possible home for Prince Charles!

Edward Stanhope(1846-1893), the second son of Phi forefather of whom we should be proud!

Educated at Harrow and Christ Church, Oxford, he s at the Inner Temple and whilst establishing his career matches for Kent!

What a career was being forged!

Member of Parliament for Mid-Lincolnshire and late further prestigious offices of state awaited: Parlian Under Secretary of State for India, Vice-President of Trade, Secretary of State for the Colonies and Secre State for the Colonies(1886-1887) he was also busily formulating plans for the new spa near the villa Spa!......


#### What Our Visitors are saying



#### Meet the Directors

I was born in Blyth, Northumberland – a Geordie. However, I was expected to "speak properly" i.e. not in dialect. Interestingly, I can "taak aboot gaanin hyem, hinnie", quite easily now!

My mother wanted to call me Gillian but as inadvisable in those days of Imperial Measure I had a wonderful childhood of freedom wit explored the sand dunes; we went for walk picnics – as long as we were home by a cer watch but we became adept at estimating time In my teens, I was a member of various sch but my school days were dominated by sport. After A levels I trained for teaching at Heac returned to Blyth and taught at a "rather rou met at the tennis club.



We married and lived in Newcastle upon Tyne, where Don was employed by Martins Bank. I taught for 2 years until the birth of Christopher and then Jeremy. When Jeremy was three months old, Don was promoted to the lovely Northumbrian town of Hexham, where we lived for two years.

1966 was a memorable year. Sadly, my mother died in April; in May, Don was appointed Manager of Martins Bank in Boston (I was taken aback by this as, ignorantly, I knew only of Boston Mass.) In June, I sold the house and with the boys (aged three and two), joined Don in Boston - Lincolnshire! On 14<sup>th</sup> July, Roger was born. I have always had a lot of energy.

In 1971, Don became Manager of Barclays in Horncastle and we moved to "Robin Lodge," on Horncastle Road, Woodhall Spa. I taught at St. Andrew's School, which our sons attended; we had many friends and there were parties and outings and travels abroad with the caravan; there was the Tennis club and the Golf Club for Don; we were very happy.

In 1985 Don was promoted again and we moved to Grantham but when he retired, naturally we returned to Woodhall Spa! We enjoyed travel and at one time visited two sons living in U.S.A. as well as having an apartment at the golfing complex, La Manga, in Spain and a cabin in Switzerland. A sixtieth birthday present was a paraglide in Switzerland. I did this from the Schilthorn, at 6,000 metres. It was wonderful!

In 1985, I had an unfortunate accident from which I was not expected to recover. Afterwards, an elderly lady of our acquaintance said, alarmingly, "Marjorie, you must have been spared for great purpose"!!
