


Woodhall Spa, I love it.


You should all be very proud.



Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum

On the 30 August, at 3.15pm, I finally plucked up the courage to press the 'submit' button on the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) Round 2 Application Form; resisting the temptation to read through it one more time! A lot of the 'paperwork' had been posted to the HLF on a CD the previous Saturday. For Jackie, Pam, David Hill and myself, there was a lot of work carried out over the Bank Holiday weekend to finalise the last few items. Furthermore, none of us realised just how much time and effort was required to produce the all important Activity Plan; thank you Jackie for the tremendous endeavours that you put in to complete it. Thanks also to all the other museum's volunteers who have contributed to the production of all the supporting documentation required (and there was a lot!).

So, what happens now? The HLF personnel will spend the next 3 months going through our submission and we may be asked to provide additional information or clarify aspects of the application. Our Case Officer, plus a member of the committee, will visit the museum for a day to discuss our project. That day will be our opportunity to 'sell' the project and its subsequent benefits to the community. The committee will meet in early December and, to a great extent, success will depend on who we are in competition with. As per 'DIY Village SOS', I should get a phone call, possibly on that day, with, hopefully, good news.

What have we asked for? The good news is that we are still only asking HLF to fund 83% of the project. The bad news is that the project costs have risen significantly from the estimate in our Round 1 submission. The project cost is now £804,000 and we are looking for a grant of £667,400 from HLF. Due to the fire, ELDC now consider the outbuildings to be 'new build' and all the new regulations for carbon reduction, draught proofing etc apply. They also demand that, in the event of a fire, the main structure retains its structural integrity for an hour, rather than half an hour, which has a high cost penalty. At Round 1, we had not built in the costs of the Activity Plan implementation (£87,000) and we have significantly increased volunteer time (from £9000 to £56,000) – which is considered a project cost as well as project income. Our anticipated matched funding income has also reduced, due to the present economic climate. To compensate, we have significantly increased the contribution from our funds – which has meant that we have had to dip further than we hoped into our reserves. This makes the Appeal even more important. The total is rising, but we still have a way to go.

We now wait, and hope, for good news in early December. If that happens, then our fully revamped museum will be ready for opening in Easter 2013. Note that the work will not interfere with the operation of the museum during the 2012 season. One recent piece of good news is that we have received conditional approval for a grant of £9515 from Lincolnshire County Council for the project – a sign of things to come? I hope so!

GN04244 – With this issue coming out close to Remembrance Sunday, I thought it appropriate to show this World War 1 image of soldiers convalescing and their nurses, probably at the Alexandra Hospital. Note the blue uniforms that the soldiers used to wear, rather than their normal khaki uniforms.



GN04116 – In this family group, the soldier in the back row has been 'pasted in'. We have another print/plate with a gap where the soldier is shown. Considering the technology available, the 'pasting' is very good. Again, the dress suggests World War 1. Unfortunately, we do not know the date, location or the name of the family.



2nd Arnhem Commemoration

Saturday September 24th 2011 was the second year that veterans, Air training Corps cadets, members of the British Legion and The Anglo-Polish Society joined with residents of Woodhall Spa to commemorate Arnhem. Revd. Andrew Smith led a short service in St. Peter's church after which the assembled Standards and the Veterans, led by a lone piper, processed across The Broadway to the Cottage Museum, where wreaths were laid.

Councillor Tim Peacock represented the Parish Council and District Cllr. Craig Leyland played an active part in the service. R.A.F Coningsby and B.B.M.F. both sent representatives.

Visitors to the village were able to see the Lancaster circling on two occasions as well as the Hurricane fly past at lunchtime.

Following lunch in St. Peter's Hall Veterans were able to participate in guided tours of the Roughton and Kirkby Moor army camps, in mini buses kindly loaned by St. Hugh's school, together with other places in the village where troops were based. Special displays were mounted on the Kirkby Moor site so that visitors were able to view photographs and handle artefacts unearthed through tree clearing and gardening. These prompted memories and reminiscences, often good humoured!



Meet the Directors

I was born in Perry Barr, Birmingham in 1946. When I was three my parents moved to Sutton Coldfield and that is where I lived until 1969. I started school when I was four. My future husband John, his twin brother and older sister were already pupils there. Growing up, I enjoyed a variety of outside activities including music lessons and singing in the church choir. I became involved with the Guide movement,



firstly as a Brownie, then as a Guide and I became a Guide leader when I was seventeen. We camped for a week every summer, travelling to the camp site, which was usually in the Cotswolds, on a flatbed lorry. The equipment was piled in the middle and we sat round the outside singing. What fun! So much for Health and Safety but no one ever fell off.

My family spent every summer holiday in St. Agnes, Cornwall because my grandparents retired there in 1949. The little cottage had electricity but no gas so cooking was done on an antiquated paraffin stove. I recently saw an identical model in a museum in Jersey. With no motorways and our little old black Hillman car laden with luggage, the journey took ten hours.

My father was a well known musician throughout the Midlands. In addition to teaching piano, lecturing and giving recitals, he became the music critic for The Birmingham Post and Mail so from my earliest years I went to concerts and classical music festivals. Through him I have inherited a love of classical music but sadly not his talent.

I always wanted to be a primary school teacher and I realized my ambition in 1967, having trained in Derby. By this time John and I were engaged and we married two years later. He started work with the National Provincial Bank in Birmingham but was moved to Leicester in 1966. We set up home, firstly in Oadby and then Kibworth. We lived in Leicestershire for 38 years. John joined the building society in 1971, which after several mergers became the Alliance and Leicester, now Santander.

I continued my teaching career until 2005. I had a break for several years after our son Chris and then our daughter Sally were born. Throughout that time, as well as teaching children of all prim ary ages from four to eleven, I ran a play group, helped to organize and run a thriving holiday play scheme and put on Christmas parties for senior citizens.

John's love of golf, in particular the Hotchkin Course, resulted in him becoming a member of Woodhall Spa Golf Club in 1995. It was therefore a sensible decision to relieve him of a weekly four hour round trip and come to live here. We moved in April 2007 a week after he retired. It was the best decision we could have made.

I joined the museum volunteer team in 2009. I have had the opportunity to be involved with various activities and as part of the Learning Team I am still engaging with young people either in school or at the museum. I also represent the museum on the Aviation Heritage Committee. As well as helping to put up displays I can often be found on my hands and knees in the garden - it helps to be flexible in more ways than one!
